Dear Parents and Community Members,

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The annual report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education offers a comprehensive picture of how Centennial Middle School performs overall as a school. In the 2013-14 school year, Centennial Middle School earned an Overall State Rating of 5 on a 5 point scale. This past year, 2014-2015, a new assessment (Smarter Balanced) replaced our previous end-of-year tests. Therefore, schools will not receive a rating since these scores will serve as a new baseline.

As part of our effort toward continuous improvement, we restructured our teams and transitioned from five person teams to four person teams. This change will result in smaller class sizes, more individual student attention, and an increase of instructional time in core subjects. To echo Superintendent Bryer's words, "We are a good school, and we are going to get even better!"

The staff at Centennial Middle School is committed to preparing each student for success in high school and beyond. We believe it is our mission is to empower and inspire all students to apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to become curious learners, creative problem solvers, to achieve personal success, and to become caring contributors to society.

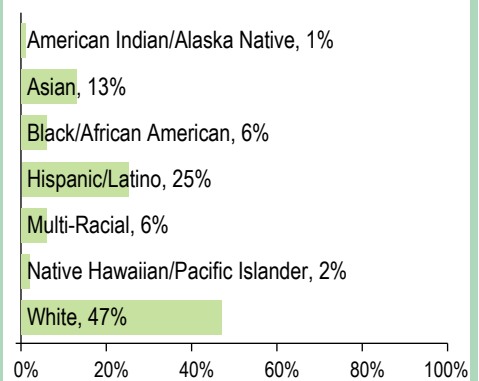

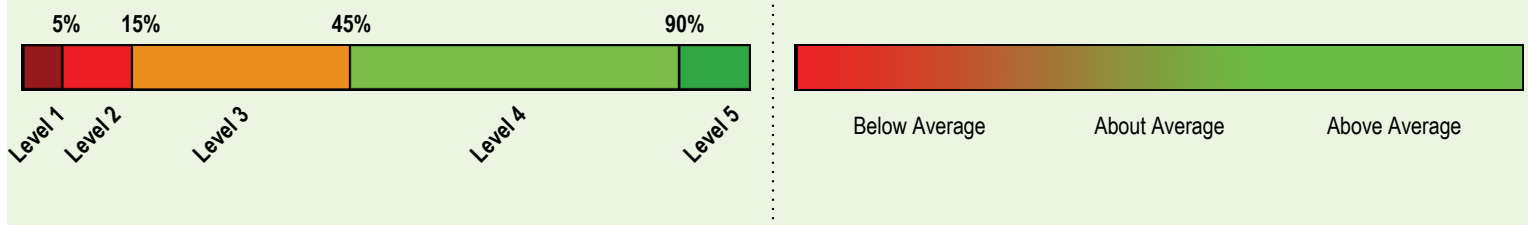
